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**Content:** This is a good piece of work. The literature base is unusually extensive and contains a genuine debate about an ambiguous area of inquiry. The argument is properly qualified and the use of footnotes assists this process and illustrates the unusual extent of the reading undertaken. The conclusions are carefully spelled out and taken to the research methodology in an effective way. The methodology is described and discussed in unusual detail and the focus on Denmark grounds the study well. The findings are discussed with care and establish a well qualified appreciation of the subject and a sense of the limits of the inquiry. To an extent I am a sceptic, 'sociological' hard case in relation to ideas such as these. However, it is a very convincing piece of work overall.

**Structure:** There is excellent handling of the scope and boundaries of the work. A personal cohesion is imposed together with a vision of possibilities. This underpins the sense of energy and direction. In this sense structure and content are intimately linked.
